Program Expansion

- Adult Sessions: Held inaugural programs for adults in Ft. Lauderdale, with plans to expand across the state in 2025.
- Civic Engagement: Expanded programs to teach youth about the power of their voice and vote.

Teacher Network: Over 30 qualified teachers on staff, ensuring high-quality instruction and mentorship for all participants.




Financial Achievements
